As the school year winds down, the CISD Board of Trustees expressed their pleasure with the opportunity to recognize students and their accomplishments.

The CHS football team and the boys basketball team were honored for advancing three deep into the playoffs. Coach Cody Farrell and Coach Roger Brown complimented the senior players for their leadership and character.

Coach John McSheffery led the boys and girls powerlifters to regionals where athletes placed across several weight classes.

The Board approved a continuation of the five-year contract with Chartwells for food service management. Superintendent Charlie Alderman said administrators were pleased with their service.

Four properties were sold in tax foreclosure cases. Three properties are located in Neylandville and the other is in Fairlie.

The Board approved updates to local policy resulting from a policy review by TASB in November. Dr. Mark Reid made a motion to maintain dollar amounts required for Board approval at lower levels, not the \$50,000 suggested.

Assistant Superintendent Dr. Patricia Tremmel explained how the District was cited in the state's discipline data validation for having an out-of-school suspension extend past three days. She said the citation was noted and ensured the Board that steps were taken to ensure it didn't happen again.

- Accepted resignations from Jesse Casarez, CMS band director; Chad Harris, CHS math teacher; and Devan Marrow, CHS math teacher,
- Jenna O'Neal resigned her dual contract of teacher/coach and was offered a teacher only contract;
- Employed Stephen Clayton, CMS math; Jack Brandon, CMS science; and Wietske Tillema, ACW teacher;
- Approved contracts for teachers, counselors, school nurse and athletic trainer and Tri County SSA personnel;
- Accepted resignation from Nancy Brightwell, Tri County diagnostician.

- Enrollment is up 1538, the highest count this school year.
- CISD PD Chief Joe Venable showed the board the body worn cameras that were being purchased for Officer Contreras and himself.
