District, campus plans approved

Assistant Superintendent Dr. Patricia Tremmel presented the District and Campus Improvement Plan highlights at the October regular Board of Trustees meeting.

The District plan has three new initiatives which are being put into action. A suicide protocol and prevention manual was developed by campus guidance counselors and Dr. Tremmel. Training for campus and top level administrators will take place during two days this fall.

English, language arts and reading instructional programs are being studied to determine the best curriculum for grades three through eight. A vendor fair will be held here for core subjects so that teachers can help in the decision making.

The Texas ACE program, under the direction of the Boys & Girls Club, is conducting after-school tutoring and academic enrichment every day. As the program gets off the ground many activities are expected to be added to encourage attendance and interest.

Board approves freezer purchase and cooler conversion

The Board approved a proposal from North Texas Fab to convert a walk-in freezer to a cooler and add a walk-in freezer outside at CMS. The plan was proposed by the food service provider, Chartwells, several years ago, according to Director of Finance John Walker. The new arrangement will allow more space to not only cool food but also for food preparation with no cost to the District.

Tax resale properties approved

A total of nine properties were approved for sale due to tax foreclosures in and around Commerce. Superintendent Charlie Alderman said he was glad to get the property back on the tax rolls.

Enrollment is up 18 students from this time last year--1529.
